
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LIFE GROUPS DISCUSSION GUIDE



EASTER SUNDAY Mark 16:6

April 4, 2021

CONNECT

1. Are any of you staring at a tomb? Can you think of a time you sat in despair, grief or hopelessness?

CELEBRATE

2. Read Matthew 27:61. Picture the scene. What promises had Jesus made that now seemed hopeless as the women stared at a sealed and full tomb (Matthew 26:31–32, John 12:23–33, 14:1–3)?

3. Even in their grief, the women sought to honor Jesus. What does it actually look like to trust God by faith on days of grief, waiting or shock?

4. As a group, tell each other the resurrection story as well as you can from memory. Then read Mark 16:1–8. What details did you tell? What details did you miss? Why do the details matter?

5. Why does Jesus' death and the empty tomb matter for you today?

6. The resurrection is the clearest description that Jesus has the final word. What has Jesus overcome through His resurrection (John 16:33, 1 John 3:5, 1 Corinthians 15:20, 26, 55; Revelation 21:4, Colossians 2:15)?

7. How do the truths in question 6 then fuel your worship? Your service? Your perseverance and hope? Your engagement in this world?

8. What would keep you from actively bowing before Jesus and embracing Him as Savior and Lord?

9. If a neighbor, coworker or family member asks you about how your Easter or weekend was, what truth could you share to open a door for spiritual conversation?
