The Rich Fool Luke 12:13-21

May 2, 2021

CONNECT

1. If you won the lottery, what would you want to do with it?

CELEBRATE

- 2. Read Luke 12:13–15. Look at the set-up to the parable. What does the man from the crowd think Jesus' teaching is talking about? How does Jesus respond and what does he command him to do?
- 3. Read Luke 12:16–21. Who does the rich man talk to for counsel or wisdom as he plans for the future? Who doesn't he consult?
- 4. Observe all the places where the rich man says "I", "me" or "my". What does this indicate? How does this square with Psalm 24:1?
- 5. How can you tell the difference in your own life between wise planning (good stewardship) and idolatry (finding your identity or treasure in something other than Jesus)?
- 6. What helps you keep your heart tender to Jesus and what He treasures instead of letting the cares and riches and pleasures of life take priority (Luke 8:14)?
- 7. Read Luke 12:19–20 and James 4:13–15. Why is it unwise to presume upon tomorrow?
- 8. Whether or not you feel like you have an overabundance, how much do you think about being a good steward of what God has entrusted to you? How can you cultivate generosity with what you do have?
- 9. What ought disciples be like according to Luke 12:21, 30–31? What does that actually look like?
