The Barren Fig Tree Luke 13:6-9

May 9, 2021

CONNECT

1. Have you had or helped with cultivating farmland, crops or fruit-bearing trees? What kind of intentionality and work was involved?

CELEBRATE

- 2. Read Luke 13:6–9. Pray for God to give insight and humility as you seek to hear and respond to the Word.
- 3. What kind of fruit was Jesus talking about in this parable?
- 4. Reflect on the past two months. What kind of fruit has been produced in your life? Good? Bad? Mixed-bag? Share some specific examples.
- 5. In what ways is Jesus an advocate for us like the vinedresser is for the fig tree?
- 6. Look back at verse 8 and the steps the vinedresser takes to try to jumpstart the fig tree's fruitfulness (digging/irrigation, manure/nourishment, time/seasons). Consider how those steps can help you cultivate fruitfulness.
- 7. Read John 15:1-8.
 - What kind of urgency does Jesus express here and in the parable from Luke 13? How is God's grace demonstrated even in the midst of the vines/trees possibly being cut down and burned?
 - What role does pruning play in fruitfulness? In what ways might God be pruning you right now?
