The Banquets Luke 14:7–24

May 16, 2021

CONNECT

1. Think of a party you enjoyed. What made it so enjoyable? How did this party reflect the kingdom of heaven?

CELEBRATE

- 2. Read Luke 14:7. What situation does lesus address? Who are the people lesus is addressing? See Luke 14:1–6.
- 3. Read the first parable in Luke 14:8–11. Most people see humility as the opposite of honor. How does Jesus tie humility and honor together?
- 4. What is the difference between pride and honor? How does Jesus use this parable to lead people away from pride and toward honor?
- 5. Jesus switches His focus in Luke 14:12–14. Who does He shift attention to? What attitude of the heart is this second parable addressing?
- 6. Jesus' first parable focuses on honor while the second focuses on being repaid for your deeds. Does Jesus rebuke these desires? How does Jesus use these desires to reshape their actions from self-centered to other-centered?
- 7. In Luke 14:15, Jesus again shifts His focus. Who is He now addressing? What attitude does this person display that Jesus feels compelled to address? (Hint: Who does this person think is "in" versus who is "out"?)
- 8. Read Luke 14:16–24. Many people did not taste the banquet. Whose choices kept them out? Who did the master want to be at the feast?
- 9. In the kingdom of heaven, who will be at the feast? What will that crowd look like?

CONTRIBUTE

- 10. How can we live out these parables as citizens of the kingdom—honoring others, inviting those who cannot repay us and filling the feast hall? What kind of lifestyle do these parables compel us to live?
- 11. Brainstorm a few ideas of how you can live out this lifestyle as a group. Pick one to focus on, then put it into action. (Examples: Host a party and invite the most needy or publicly honor someone who humbly serves.)
