The Shrewd Manager Luke 16:1–9

June 6, 2021

CONNECT

1. What things or people have been most influential in how you approach money (parents, books, podcast, financial planner, friend, etc.)?

CELEBRATE

- 2. Read Luke 16:1–9. Pray together that God would give you ears to hear and eyes to see what He's saying in this passage.
- 3. At first glance, the manager in this parable seems like a bad example to follow. What things do you notice in the parable that he does wrong?
- 4. In verse 8, Jesus contrasts the "sons of this world" and the "sons of light." Who are each of these and what is Jesus implying about them here?
- 5. Skim over what Jesus says or implies about money in Luke 16:9, 11, 13. Does He portray it positively or negatively? What's the viability and outcome of all wealth (see verse 9)?
- 6. In contrast to the fact that wealth will fail us, Jesus points toward our eternal dwelling in the life to come (end of verse 9). How often do you think about heaven? To what extent does (or doesn't) it impact what you do with money?
- 7. Honestly assess your current financial commitments. Do they reflect (directly or indirectly) someone entering the kingdom of heaven?

8. Read Matthew 6:19–21. What changes or investments could you make that would store up heavenly treasures and bring people into the kingdom of heaven?
