The Rich Man & Lazarus Luke 16:19–31

June 13, 2021

CONNECT

1. Reflect back to your graduation commencement. What stuck out to you? What was significant about that moment? Was it exciting? Full of anxiety? Why?

CELEBRATE

Read Luke 16:19–20

2. List out the differences between the rich man and Lazarus. Why are these differences significant?
3. Jesus' audience would have related to the rich man and expected that he would be in heaven. Why wasn't he? (Consider this parable in light of Matthew 25:41–46.)
4. The name Lazarus is a form of the name Eleazar, which means "the one God helps." How does this common name help you understand the poor man's life and eternal reality?
5. Parables are stories that illustrate Jesus' kingdom priorities. What priorities do we see in the parable of the rich man and Lazarus?
6. What do your life's actions reveal about what you truly believe? Are you holding anything as more valuable than life with Jesus? If so, stop and confess these things together. Ask God to help you better use what He has given you for His glory and the eternal good of others.
7. The Bible is clear, there is heaven (Revelation 21:4–8) and there is hell (Matthew 25:46, Revelation 21:8). Why does this reality make so many people, even Christians, uncomfortable? As Christians, what should our response be to this reality (Matthew 4:17, 28:16–20, Romans 10:9–15)?

CONTRIBUTE

8. As a group, consider how many non-Christians you know. What's the estimated number? It is no coincidence that God has placed you in their lives.
 - Have everyone pick one or two non-Christians in their lives and, as a group, begin praying for these people by name. Pray for opportunities for the gospel to be shared with them, pray their hearts would be soft to the truth of Jesus and that they would join the family of God. Check in with one another throughout the week to see how each other are doing.
 - Close by praying for these people and the opportunities that will come.
