OUR HERO HEALS Psalms 103:3

1. Who is your favorite superhero and why?
2. Read Psalm 103 in its entirety. How have you (or someone you know) experienced Jesus as the hero who heals?
3. Find some other examples in Scripture of times that God healed miraculously. How do these illustrate God's heart for healing and restoration?
4. What is a situation where it seems like God has chosen not to heal? How does Scripture inform, encourage and enlighten us in the darkness of that space?
5. What is a current need for healing that you or someone close to you has? Using Psalm 103 as inspiration, spend some time in prayer for Jesus to be the hero who heals.
