DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

AUGUST 22, 2021

OUR HERO SATISFIES Psalm 103:5

Icebreaker

1. When have you felt truly satisfied by God? Share one or two stories around the group.

Going Deeper

2. The greatest crisis requires the greatest hero to rescue us. What is our great crisis? Why do we need a hero?
3. Read Genesis 1:31. In this verse, what is the state of the world? What is the state of humanity? What do these things tell us about what God intended for us?
4. God created the world and filled it with only good things. Why, then, would God want His children to avoid eating from the "Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil" (Genesis 2:16-17)? What did He want to protect His children from? Why?
5. Read John 17:6. What did Jesus make manifest on earth? What can we conclude about how the Father sees us by watching how Jesus lived?
6. Read Psalm 107:1. What is the essence of goodness? What makes something good? What makes something evil (devoid of good)?
7. Read Psalm 23. Why is David so confident that goodness will follow him all the days of his life? How did the goodness of God sustain him through his difficult life?
8. Why does our Hero Jesus want to satisfy us with good?

Action

9. Think of a friend who is struggling right now. How could you encourage them with Psalm 103:5? How can they experience the goodness of God in the midst of their struggles?
10. Take a moment to make a list of five things that you are truly thankful for. Once everyone has their list, praise God out loud for each good thing He has given.
