GROWING TOGETHER Ephesians 4:15–16

ICE-BREAKER

1. Which community in your life has made you feel the most supported, loved and encouraged? How?

GOING DEEPER

2. Read Ephesians 4:11–16 out loud. What stands out to you from this passage?
3. Consider the phrase “speak the truth in love” (4:15). What does it mean to speak the truth without love? What does it mean to express love but lack truth? Based on your answers, why is it so necessary for the people of God to speak the truth in love?
4. What does it mean to “grow up in every way into Christ” (4:15)? How does speaking the truth in love help us accomplish this? Practically speaking, how do we help each other grow up into Christ?
5. What does it mean for us as a church community that Christ is the head of the church (4:15)? If Christ possesses all authority, what response does that require from us?
6. The body of Christ is the most diverse community in the world, with billions of people scattered across every country. How then do we unite with each other, every joint and ligament connected (4:16)? How do we join with each other, aligning together in Christ?
7. Read again the last half of Ephesians 4:16—“when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.” What does Christian maturity look like? How can the church best foster this kind of growth?

ACTION

8. Look around your group. Consider what life would look like if you each tried to live out your Christianity alone. What would you miss if you didn't have this group together with you? Share these things with each other.
9. How does a healthy church community demonstrate to the world that Christ's claims are true (Acts 2:42–47, John 13:35)? How is your group one of the ways that the world hears the gospel?
