Discussion Guide

September 19, 2021

MULTIPLYING DISCIPLES Matthew 28:19–20

ICE-BREAKER

1. Have you recently had a spiritual conversation with someone? How did it begin and what wisdom did you glean for further spiritual conversations either with that person or others?

GOING DEEPER

2. 2 Timothy 2:2 finds the Apostle Paul exhorting Timothy to entrust biblical truth to those around him that they can then pass along to others. Equipping believers to know God's Word is very important. Is growing in knowledge of biblical truth the end goal? Why or why not?
3. Read Psalm 96:3 and Acts 1:8. What is the desired outcome made clear by God in these verses? Also consider Matthew 28:19–20 and Mark 1:17.
4. In Acts 1:8, what does it practically mean to be “witnesses” for Jesus?
5. Talk about things that get in the way of being good witnesses. How might we purposefully remove such hindrances?
6. Read Acts 2:37–47. Learning from the influence of both an individual (Peter) and the community (many believers), what do you hope your church, with you as an active participant, would do to see others follow Jesus—to multiply disciples.

ACTION

7. What tangible ways can you help your church family “declare God's glory among the nations” (Psalm 96:3)? Think in terms of your money, your time and your community.
8. Name five people with whom you can have spiritual conversations. Pray with your Life Group or family right now for them. Pray for God to orchestrate the opportunity for those conversations to unfold. How might you remain accountable to this commitment?
