Discussion Guide

January 2, 2022

CONNECTION Hebrews 13:1–2

CONNECT

1. Have you ever had an experience when you thought you might be interacting with an angel? Why did this stand out? What might be a lesson learned from this experience?

GOING DEEPER

2. Read Hebrews 13:1. Why is it important to continue giving love to others, particularly sisters and brothers in Christ? See 1 John 4:7–21 for additional insight.
3. Consider Hebrews 13:2. One of the key ethics of the Bible is to honor those who are strangers or who are oppressed. Take time and survey Exodus 22:21, 23:9–12; Leviticus 19:10, 33–34; Deuteronomy 27:19; Psalm 146:9; Zechariah 7:10 and Matthew 25:35–46. Based on what you read, why is kindness and care to strangers and the oppressed so important to God?
4. When combining the first two verses of Hebrews 13, what lessons are learned about connection, community and hospitality? See 1 Thessalonians 5:11, Hebrews 10:25 and Acts 2:42. How might this influence you personally?

ACTION

5. In this COVID world, what will it look like for you to engage in genuine and healthy community with other sisters and brothers in Christ? What intentional role can you play?
6. Identify three people you can be hospitable and prayerful toward. Determine how you might connect with them within the next 60 days.
