# **GENEROSITY** Hebrews 13:5

## CONNECT

1. Money is one of those topics that can make those attending church uncomfortable. Why is that? What has been your experience with churches and money?

### **GOING DEEPER**

- 2. Read Hebrews 13:1–6. Notice that there are two kinds of love mentioned in these verses—love for people and love of money. Why is one to be cultivated and the other avoided? What are the ways in which these get confused in our own lives and the world in which we live?
- 3. What are some root causes of infatuation with money? For help, consider Proverbs 16:8, 21:5, 22:16; Matthew 6:25 and Mark 4:19.
- 4. Read Malachi 3:10. What two financial principles for God's people may be found in this verse and why do these principles matter? See Exodus 36:5 and Luke 6:38 for additional clarity.
- 5. The Apostle Paul says in 2 Corinthians 9:6 that whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. He also says in 1 Timothy 6:9–11 that those who long to be rich fall into all kinds of temptations that we should flee from. How do disciples of Jesus reconcile these two verses?
- 6. Consider 1 John 3:16–18 and Acts 4:32–37. Taking their cues from Jesus, Christians throughout time have been exceedingly generous people. Why does this matter and how might you be as well?

## ACTION

- 7. If you had to encourage the people of New Hope Church to be generous to God's work, what would you say? What would be your "ask" and your "why"?
- 8. James 1:5 states, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him." Take time to pray for wisdom about being financially generous to God and His work. Rooted in the generosity of Jesus, ask Him to increase both your desire and your doing in this regard. Trust Him to help you, remembering the promise of Hebrews 13:5 where God says, "I will never leave you nor forsake you.
