DENUNCIATION Galatians 1:6–10

CONNECT

1. How would you explain the gospel in one sentence? Let everyone in the group give an answer.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Before you open your Bibles, introduce each other to the book of Galatians as best you can from memory. Ask each other: What do you know about Galatians?
- 3. Read Galatians 1:6–7. Why is Paul writing this letter? What emotion do you imagine Paul is feeling as he sat down to write this letter?
- 4. Read Galatians 1:3–5. How could you tell the gospel to someone using only these verses? Why does Paul begin his letter by laying this out so clearly?
- 5. Read Galatians 1:8–9. What is at stake? What are people risking by letting the gospel be distorted?
- 6. What kind of distortions to the gospel have you encountered? How did you recognize it was a distortion?

ACTION

- 7. How can we be on guard, helping each other hold fast to the real gospel? How can we do this in a life-giving way instead of a legalistic way (see Ephesians 1:7, 2:13–16)?
- 8. As a thought exercise, imagine two churches—one that holds to the true gospel and one that follows a distorted gospel. How does each church affect its city? How will each church's beliefs affect the way it approaches the people of the city? How does this inform the way we live at New Hope Church?
