DEFENSE Galatians 1:16

CONNECT

1. Why is the gospel good news? Try to summarize your answer in 1–2 sentences.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Galatians 1:11–12 out loud. Based on Paul's defense, what accusations had been leveled against him? How would you rephrase these accusations in today's language?
- 3. Read Acts 26:12–17. What "mission statement" did Jesus give to Paul? Where do you see this expressed in Paul's writings in Galatians 1?
- 4. Read Luke 4:16–30. What point was Jesus making? Why did this enrage the people of Nazareth? Out of all the messages Jesus could have preached, why do you suppose He chose this one?
- 5. Read Galatians 2:6–10 aloud. Why does Paul take care to explain this to the Galatians? Why does it matter?
- 6. Read Revelation 7:9–10. How is Paul's defense of the gospel necessary for this to happen?

ACTION

- 7. What is your gospel story? Tell your story as simply as you can, focusing it around the thought: "This is what Jesus has done for me." After each story, praise God together for what He has done.
- 8. If you don't have a gospel story, begin yours today. Pray with your group to receive Jesus as your Savior and yield your life in service to Him. Receive His life. Then embrace your newfound brothers and sisters in your group, those you will live with forever in the kingdom of God.
- 9. How does your gospel story provide a way for non-Christians to understand the power of Jesus? Who can you share your story with who needs to hear about Jesus and His power to work in their life?
