DISCUSSION GUIDE April 10, 2022

WHO IS JESUS? Matthew 16:13–17

CONNECT

1. Why does it matter that we know who Jesus is?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Matthew 16:13–14. Jesus asks His disciples who the people in the world think He is. Think of our world today. Who would people today say that Jesus is?
- 3. In a sentence or two, how would you answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15)
- 4. Why is there so much tension, passion and debate over the matter of who Jesus is? What is at stake?
- 5. What difference does it make in your life that Jesus is who He says He is? How does this impact your life practically?
- 6. In Mere Christianity, C.S. Lewis argues: "I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God. That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God or else a madman or something worse." How do you answer Lewis' question—is Jesus a liar, a lunatic or the Lord? How can this question help explain Jesus to others?
- 7. Read Matthew 16:20–21. Why do you think Jesus commanded them to be silent for now?
- 8. If someone watched the way you lived your life for the past month, what might they conclude about who you think Jesus is?

ACTION

- 9. Imagine that someone you know comes up to you and asks, "Who is Jesus?" How would you answer? How would you demonstrate that Jesus truly is who you say He is? Role-play this conversation in your group.
- 10. Take time to pray through 1 Peter 3:15: "In your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." Pray that the Lord will give you the chance this week to share your answer with someone who needs it.
