THE BREAD OF LIFE John 6:35

CONNECT

1. Close your eyes, sit quietly and take stock of what's going on inside you. Is what you're feeling closer to restlessness or satisfaction? Share your answers.

GOING DEEPER

2. To what extent should Christians expect to feel satisfied by God? Why?
3. Read John 6:28–34. What do the people want in verse 34? What do they think they're asking for?
4. Read John 6:35–40. What is Jesus saying here? How would you explain in your own words what Jesus means by calling Himself the Bread of Life?
5. We satisfy our hunger for food by eating things like bread. How do we satisfy our hunger for God? What practical actions can we take to pursue this satisfaction?
6. When have you felt truly satisfied in God? Share your stories around the group. What can you learn from these stories about how to be satisfied in Jesus?
7. In ancient Israelite culture, bread was life. If you could eat bread every day, you lived. If you had no bread to eat, you'd die. What insight does this give you into Jesus' words?
8. Read Matthew 6:11, then John 6:35. How does the second verse inform the first verse?

ACTION

9. Suppose a neighbor asks you why you believe in Jesus. You decide to answer by talking about how Jesus satisfies. How do you express this to them in a way they can understand?
