TABITHA Acts 9:36–43

CELEBRATE

1. Who are some everyday catalysts that you know? Who is sharing and showing Jesus in their everyday life?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. When people use the word "Christian" today, what do they typically mean? In Acts 9:36 & 38, Tabitha and the believers in Joppa are called disciples. What is a disciple?
- 3. Read Titus 3:4–8. On what basis are people saved (v.5)? For those who are saved, what should they then be devoted to (v.8)? How is Tabitha an example of this? (See Acts 9:36, 39).
- 4. As the story unfolds, Tabitha is miraculously raised from the dead and many believed in the Lord because of her. In Romans 8:10–11, those who believe are likewise said to be raised to life in Christ. Where have you seen the resurrection power of Jesus at work in your life?

ACTION

5. Consider how you could be used like Tabitha to share and show Jesus in your everyday life. Think broadly: What skills or abilities could you use for good works and charity?

Think specifically: What can you do this week to put that into motion?

6. Where do you need to see the resurrection power of Jesus? Pray for those things together.
