

CORNELIUS Acts 10:1-8

CONNECT

1. What family or household has been a catalyst for your relationship with Jesus?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Cornelius was a man of devotion. What specific things are written in Acts 10:1–4 that demonstrate his devotion to the Lord?
- 3. Share some examples of things you've been devoted to in different seasons of your life. What has devotion to the Lord looked like?
- 4. Have you ever encountered an angel or seen a vision? How should we go about discerning if a vision is from God?
- 5. God's vision to reach all peoples with the message of Jesus is revealed to Peter in Acts 10:28, 34–35. Look at those verses and consider what people groups today are marginalized or seen as "common or unclean" (v. 28).
- 6. Read Acts 10:42–43. What was the early church commanded to preach and testify? Where is forgiveness found?

ACTION

- 7. In verse 24, Cornelius calls together all his relatives and close friends to hear about Jesus. Who are some friends or relatives of yours that need to hear about the forgiveness of Jesus?
- 8. Cornelius the Roman soldier would have been viewed as an unlikely catalyst for the gospel. How does he help bring fulfillment to Acts 1:8? How can his story inspire you to being an everyday catalyst this week?
