DISCUSSION GUIDE

July 24, 2022



JASON Acts 17:1–9

CONNECT

1. Which everyday catalyst (either from NHC or the book of Acts) have you connected with most so far in our series?

GOING DEEPER

2. Read Acts 17:1–9. Pray together for the Holy Spirit to give you open hearts and minds to how God wants to work in your lives through this passage.
3. What's the essence of the message that Paul and Silas proclaimed in verses 2–3? How does this connect with Acts 1:1–3, 8?
4. We see two distinct responses to the message described in verses 4–5. What stands out to you about those who received the message? What were the hinderances for those who rejected the message?
5. Have you ever shared the message of Christ that directly? Was it received or rejected? How did you process that?
6. Take a look at what Paul, Silas, Jason and the others were accused of by the mob in verses 6–7. Think honestly about your life. Would any of those accusations found in verse 7 be true of you? Is there clear demonstration of Jesus being king of your life? If not, what might that look like?

ACTION

7. Jason's hospitality, courage and allegiance to Jesus were catalysts for the message of Jesus to take root in Thessalonica. What are some ways that you can provide hospitality or safe space for ministry to flourish?
