DISCUSSION GUIDE

August 28, 2022

ROOTED

ESTABLISHED Colossians 2:7

CONNECT

1. As you think about the world in which you find yourself, what are serious threats to your walk with Jesus and, more broadly, to today's church?

GOING DEEPER

2. Carefully review Colossians 2:8–23. Talk about the nature of the threats the Apostle Paul is exhorting about to the Colossian Christians. Which stands out to you?
3. What is meant by “the faith” in Colossians 2:7? Consider Colossians 1:12–23 and Ephesians 1:7–10. In your own words, how would you summarize “the faith” if sharing with a friend?
4. Three common threats to God’s people are power, identity questions and indifference. In what ways might the Spirit of God be speaking to you about these particular threats?
5. The language of being established in Jesus, as seen in Colossians 2:7, relates to being sure-footed in the faith. What does spiritual sure-footedness look like for you as you consider these aforementioned threats and how might you help someone else impacted by any one of them?

ACTION

6. As you head into the fall and your routines are being established, how are you being established in the faith? How are you a growing and mature ambassador of Jesus?
7. This fall finds our society facing elections, a challenging economy and many are confused around the issues of power and identity. How might you engage these things as one walking with Jesus?
8. Using Colossians 2:6–7 as your foundation, how could you share the gospel with a friend?
