GIVE Exodus 36:2-7

CONNECT

1. Why do Christians have such a difficult time talking about money?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Revelation 7:12 (a verse we explored in last week's sermon). Considering what is written in this verse, how ought we think about our money?
- 3. Jesus exhorts us about the things we treasure. Read Matthew 6:19–21. What are the implications on how we use our money? What thoughts do you have about any real or perceived tension between these words and the first part of Proverbs 13:22?
- 4. Recent surveys from reputable organizations suggest evangelical Christians give an average 2.4% of their income to their local church. What is your assessment about this number? Is it too high? Is it too low? Why or why not?
- 5. Carefully read through 2 Corinthians 9:6–11. What might be two or three life-instructive take-a-ways for you from this passage?

ACTION

- 6. In Exodus 36:5–7 we read that Moses had to tell the people to stop bringing their contributions for the Lord's work because there was more than enough. What values and vision ought to be ours for Moses' dilemma to be New Hope Church's?
- 7. Using Matthew 6:21 as your foundation, how might you share the gospel with a friend?
