NAZARETH'S PROCLAMATION Luke 1:26–38, Matthew 1:21

CONNECT

1. When did God do something that seemed impossible in your life? Share one or two stories around the group.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Luke 1:26–30. What does it mean that God "favors" Mary (1 Samuel 1:17–20, Genesis 18:3)? What happens in a person's life when God favors them?
- 3. Consider Gabriel's promise in Luke 1:31–33. What would this mean for Mary? How would this change her life? What was she sacrificing to accept God's will for her life? What would she gain?
- 4. Out of all the promises in Luke 1:31–33, which promises did Jesus fulfill in His first appearance? Which will He fulfill in His second coming?
- 5. Gabriel promised impossible things—that Mary would conceive supernaturally, that her child would be the Son of God, and that even Elizabeth conceived in her old age. What basis did Mary have to believe that these things could come true? Why does Elizabeth's pregnancy give Mary confidence?
- 6. Read Luke 1:35. Where do you see all three members of the Trinity present in this verse?
- 7. Read Luke 1:38. Why was it important for Mary to choose to accept God's plan for her life? Why is it important for you to choose to accept God's plans for you?

ACTION

- 8. Talk around your group. God has plans for every one of us, but often we fear submitting to them. Does anyone in your group feel fear about doing what God is calling them to do? If so, pray for this person and encourage them.
- 9. Likewise, if anyone has no idea what plans God might have for them, take time to pray with them and ask God to begin revealing these plans.
