BETHLEHEM'S PRAISE Luke 2:1–20

CONNECT

1. Dr. Tim Keller writes, "To glorify someone is to praise, enjoy and delight in them." In what ways have you praised, enjoyed and delighted in God lately? Why?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Psalm 117 in the English Standard Version. The word for "praise" is an intensive word implying boasting, celebrating and shining brightly. The word "extol" suggests giving commendation and doing so as one awestruck. Based on these descriptions, what are ways in which you can tangibly praise or extol the Lord?
- 3. Read Psalm 96:2, Matthew 1:21 and Luke 2:10–11. What common theme unites these verses? Talk about the ways Jesus' very name embodies this theme (see Matthew 1:21).
- 4. A key feature of the Christmas story is praise. Read through Luke 1:39–2:20. Recount the various ways in which praise, joy and glory are expressed. Talk about the who, the what and the why behind these expressions. What lessons do you learn?
- 5. The angels and the shepherds are quite public with their expressions of praise (Luke 2:13–14, 17–20). Psalm 96:3 invites us to declare God's glory among the nations. Why does this public proclamation matter?
- 6. Regarding the previous question, how might the church best do this? What is your role?

ACTION

- 7. Identify two or three specific things for which you want to give God praise, joy and glory. Take time to meaningfully sit with God and express these things.
- 8. Like the angels and shepherds of old, with whom might you share your joy regarding Jesus, His birth and His redemptive work?
