THE TEMPLE'S PERSONIFICATION Luke 2:41–52

CONNECT

1. Was there ever a time when you were left behind as a kid? Share the story.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Read Luke 2:41–52. Pray for the Holy Spirit to open your heart to the power of God's Word.
- 3. Look at Jesus' response to His mother in verses 52–53. How do His two rhetorical questions strike you? What do you think He was trying to communicate that they did not understand?
- 4. In verse 51, it says that Mary "treasured up all these things in her heart." (A similar thing is found in Luke 2:19). What might Mary have specifically noticed that she wanted to hold onto?
- 5. In Jesus we see the fulfillment of God's promises. This story highlights a few of them:
 - The Passover: Jesus came to Jerusalem every year to celebrate Passover. How did His life fulfill the Passover?
 - **The Temple:** Jesus came to His "Father's house" and remained there. How did He ultimately make the temple accessible?
 - **The Word:** Jesus sought and had incredible understanding of God's Word. Where and how do we see Jesus described as being the Word?
- 6. We're told in verse 51 that Jesus was submissive to His parents for the years that followed. What's the significance of this? What does that teach us about Jesus?

ACTION

7. Consider what God's purposes are for you in the coming year. What things are you pondering in your heart? What do you need to step out and act on? What do you need to wait and trust Him for the right timing?
