MULTIPLY Psalm 30:11-12

CONNECT

1. Share around the group about the spiritual reality of humankind and also, if you are a Christian, your new spiritual reality as one saved by Jesus.

GOING DEEPER

- 2. Psalm 30:11–12 reminds us that in Jesus our mourning is turned to dancing and we are clothed with gladness. What is it about our sin and brokenness that, when saved by Jesus, we experience such goodness? See Zephaniah 3:17 for further insight.
- 3. Jesus changing our lives through His death and resurrection motivates unfettered joy. How can we better engage in worship of Jesus both personally and within our church community? What changes might you make to worship wholeheartedly?
- 4. Read Psalm 30:12. What keeps us "silent," hindering us from proclaiming the gospel story?

ACTION

- 5. First Peter 3:15 suggests both a mindset and a "heart-set" followers of Christ must have to be people on mission for the gospel. In what ways can you develop a purposeful and clear mindset for gospel proclamation?
- 6. Regarding a good "heart-set," how might you ensure your heart is healthy and holy so it can be the "spring" (Proverbs 4:23) from which a burden to proclaim Jesus' saving power flows?
- 7. You are the strategy for gospel multiplication. Who comes across your path? How might God's Spirit connect Jesus' story and your story to someone else's story? Pray together for courage to not be silent with Jesus' saving work. Pray for specific people around you with whom you can speak about God's redeeming work. Pray what is found in Psalm 30:10: "Hear, O LORD, and be merciful to me! O LORD, be my helper!"
