RADICAL PREPARATION Luke 1:16–17

CONNECT

1. As this Christmas season unfolds, are there any spiritual traditions that you particularly value?

GOING DEEPER

- 2. The Christmas story is the story of one family (Jesus and John the Baptist are cousins—read Luke 1 & 2). In what way does Christmas bring together your family and what are the blessings or challenges of this?
- 3. God answered Zechariah and Elizabeth's prayers for a child. Which of your prayers do you believe are not being answered and how are you coping with what feels like God's silence?
- 4. Luke 1:16–17 tells us John's ministry is about turning people toward three things. What are the three things and why do they matter? See Luke 3:8–14 for further insight.
- 5. Why is it important to be a people prepared for Jesus and His kingdom? What does that look like for you?

ACTION

- 6. This Christmas, how will you be most prepared to receive the reconciling love of Jesus, live a reconciled life with someone close to you and do so with confident faith?
- 7. How can you use Luke 1:16–17 to share the gospel with your neighbor?
