

Senior Pastor's Report: Matthew St. John

Dear New Hope Church family,

What a year this has been. I have enjoyed being a senior pastor for 26 years, and I have never experienced anything like these past months. COVID-19 has had a global impact. In the midst of this pandemic, we as a community have experienced the tragic death of George Floyd. We stepped through a divisive election season. Many have lost jobs. Our educational experiences have been turned upside down. Mental health issues are on the rise. How we as a church walk out our timeless mission as disciplemakers has had to be reframed. The list goes on and on. As you look through this Annual Report, you will see evidence of God's faithfulness to New Hope Church during this challenging season.

But before you turn the page, let me offer some important commentary. God has been exceedingly faithful to New Hope Church. This season has in no way caught Him off guard or made Him unsteady. "Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136:1).

I want you to celebrate with me our tremendous staff. They have demonstrated a resiliency and tenacity that is a testament to their faith in Jesus and love for our church. I am incredibly proud of each and every one! From reimagining how we deliver our services at the Food Shelf to offering uniquely relevant resources for families, from mobilizing check-ins and care packages for our senior adults to a vigorous effort to keep students and parents engaged with Christ and His gospel, from an instant turn toward online gatherings to a well-developed combination of in-person and online worship experiences, our staff has led with humility, grace under pressure, abiding faith and excellence. I am so proud of them!

And I am proud of you. I treasure our church family. You have been an exceedingly gracious and supportive family during a most challenging stretch. You have reached out to offer encouragement and support. You have volunteered to fill gaps caused by the disorienting nature of these strange days. You have leaned in to Jesus in ways like never before. Our church family has reached still higher for the purposes and beauties of Jesus and His kingdom at a time when despair, fear and unease marked our months. As the Apostle Paul once wrote, reflecting on a certain church family he knew, "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you" (Philippians 1:3).

purpose

New Hope Church is a Christ-centered community for all peoples, moving toward Jesus and taking others with us.

Certainly, the challenges of this year are not only about the coronavirus. Racial injustice and trauma remain one of the great crises of our time. New Hope Church is becoming, by God's call, a humble and prophetic voice regarding how the gospel can bring healing and hope to this painful part of our human existence. With a posture of learning, listening, lamenting and leveraging God's Word rather than worldly expediency, our church family is continuing to let the light of Jesus shine through the deep night of injustice and sin. I remain profoundly grateful to be on this journey with you.

Many visionary endeavors have been brought forward as well. Our Elder Leadership Team displayed great wisdom in presenting the Election Shepherding Statement—a call to how we might live, love and lead through the complexities of a harsh election season. Moreover, they, along with our staff and Property Council, worked with our church family to approve a highly strategic campus restructuring—the sale of the Extended Campus and the reframing of space on our main campus. As if these things are not important enough, they led the way with uniquely relevant initiatives like supporting the One Fund with this past year's Thanksgiving Offering and giving much counsel and support for navigating our church family through the intricacies of the pandemic. They have been steadfast in praying passionately for God's mercy to be ours in unsettling times.

When politics and power were on everyone's mind, our preaching explored the Sermon on the Mount, soaking in God's kingdom-values. At the height of the election we were putting our eyes on the greater Shepherd, Poet, Warrior, King—Jesus. And in a world consumed with many false narratives, we enhanced our discernment through the wisdom of 2 Peter.

Of course, much of the good that has unfolded could not have been accomplished without your generosity. As the pandemic was becoming a reality, it was easy to imagine our church might experience significant financial hardship. Some weeks were hard, indeed. But your financial faithfulness has proven to be one of the remarkable stories of this past year. In the face of many challenges, our church family has repeatedly responded with a generous spirit. We have been able to carry on vital ministry in a difficult season, retaining staff and global partners, caring for those in need in our church and community with a posture of joy and faith. The words "thank you" feel extremely understated.

As we step forward, I want to ask you to do two things. First, I want to ask you to believe with me that Jesus is powerfully leading and loving our church family. "He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything He might be preeminent" (Colossians 1:18). Secondly, I want to ask you to follow Him with me—humbly, boldly, lovingly, trustingly, joyfully, eagerly and gratefully. "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17).




