UNTO HIM Revelation 5:11–13

January 24, 2021

CONNECT

1. When did you give God your most exuberant praise? Share the story with the group.

CELEBRATE

- 2. Revelation 5:11–14 is the crescendo of the throne room scene. Revisit Revelation 4–5 from past messages. How is the praise building? What has God already been praised for in these chapters?
- 3. Who is the "Lamb who was slain" (Revelation 5:12)? Why is He worthy to receive all this praise? (See Philippians 2:5–11 and Revelation 4:9–10).
- 4. If you heard a vast chorus shouting that a certain person is worthy of the power, the wealth, the wisdom, the strength, the honor, the glory and the praise, what would you conclude about this person? What would you expect this person to be like? Why?
- 5. Shout the song in Revelation 5:12 out loud together. Then do so again attaching the word "my" before each bit of praise: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive **my** power and **my** wealth and **my** wisdom and **my** might and **my** honor and **my** glory and **my** praise!" How does this affect your understanding of this passage?
- 6. Read Revelation 5:13. Where are you in this verse? Where is everyone you've ever loved? What is your focus in this verse? What do you imagine you'll be feeling in this moment?
- 7. Read Matthew 6:10. How does this crescendo in Revelation 5:11–13 enrich our understanding of what Matthew 6:10 is asking for?

CONTRIBUTE

- 8. Take time as a group to celebrate Jesus together. Praise Him first for who He is. Praise Him for what He has done for us in the cross. Praise Him for specific times He has worked in His power, provided with His wealth, showered His wisdom or displayed His might. Join your hearts with this choir in heaven and praise the Lamb who is worthy.
- 9. What might happen if a non-believer walked into your group while you were praising Jesus exuberantly? What might they think? How can worship be attractive?
